





What connects this image of a seventeenth-century apothecary's shop in Leiden and this glass cucurbit from an archaeological dig in Dublin in 2017?



Edward Worth owned a large number of pharmacopoeias, necessary for any practising physician in early eighteenth-century **Europe!**




